PACIFIC CREST TRAIL PRESENTATION - RICHARD BRINKMAN - WTI 2106

Pacific Crest Trail is 2650 mile footpath that runs from Mexico to Canada and passes four national monuments, six national parks, five state parks, 25 national forests and 48 federal wilderness areas. Our Sociology Instructor, Richard Brinkman hiked the PCT from April through September 2015. He studied the long-distance hiking subculture as a participant observer and conducted interviews with fellow thru-hikers along the length of the trail. His journey took 150 days. Come learn what it takes to hike 2650 miles and how he survived. If interested in doing this yourself, he is a wealth of information!
